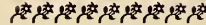

History of Golf in the West



ALTHOUGH tradition, which in this instance is rather juvenile, leads us to believe that golf was first played "at" in Chicago, when three enthusiastic Scots drove a few balls around the wilds of Jackson Park in 1887, it was only in 1893 that the first bona-fide golfing organization was formed in the west.

In August of that year a number of enthusiasts met at Belmont, about twenty-two miles from Chicago in the cottage at present occupied by Secretary Edward P. Martin, of the Western Golf Association, as a summer home, and formed the Chicago Golf Club, with the following officers:

President—J. Carolus Sterling.

Secretary—J. Marshall Weir.

Treasurer—J. B. Forgan.

Captain—Charles Blair Macdonald.

Executive Committee — The officers and H. J. Tweedie, A. H. Smith, J. G. Watson and Urban H. Broughton.

Sir Henry Truman Wood, British commissioner to the World's Fair, drove the first ball in the initial

contest which marked the opening of the links at Belmont; J. C. Sterling followed, and J. Marshall Weir, who was one of the founders of the famous Portrush Golf Club in Ireland, the home course of Miss Hezlett, the former champion of Great Britain and Ireland and the favorite links of Miss Rhona Adair, the present champion, was the third contestant to start off.

After occupying the course at Belmont for about a year, some of the members of the organization in December, 1894, purchased 200 acres of land at Wheaton, which is now the well-known home of the Chicago Golf Club. Several of the pioneer members who did not find it convenient to go to Wheaton, retained the old course at Belmont and formed an organization known as the Illinois Golf

Club which, however, was discontinued after a couple of years.

In 1895 Chicago became a factor in golf from a national standpoint, owing to the victory of Charles B. Macdonald, the first captain of the Chicago Golf Club, in the initial championship of the United States Golf Association, which was held at Newport. Again, in 1896, at Shinnecock Hills, N. Y., H. J. Whigham, of Onwentsia, carried off the premier honor and duplicated his good work the following year during the amateur championship, which was held on the links of the Chicago Golf Club, at Wheaton, where the open event was held in conjunction with it and won by Joe Lloyd, of Essex County. Two years later Chicago was once more selected for the national event, which took place at Onwentsia and was won by Herbert M. Hariman, the first American to win the Havemeyer trophy. Interest in the game spread so rapidly after the forma-

tion of the Chicago Golf Club that the local enthusiasts who became fascinated with the game proceeded to organize clubs of their own. Mr. Chatfield-Taylor and his friends organized the Lake Forest Golf Club, which soon after merged into the Onwentsia Club.

Then followed Exmoor and Riverside with several of the other clubs coming into the fold in rapid succession, until today, when the golfing organizations tributary to Chicago are second to none in the country. Although the Western women golfers have not yet reached the high golfing standard of their Eastern sisters, the quality of their play is improving every year and the continual accession of clever golfers augurs well for the

future of the game among the fair sex in the West. While none of our women experts have notably distinguished themselves in the national championships, several have shown keen form in the annual contests for the Governors' Cup at Onwentsia, which is emblematic of

Western supremacy. Five years ago this event was inaugurated and Miss Marion Shearson was the successful contestant during the first two years. In 1898 Mrs. Hobart C. Chatfield-Taylor, of Onwentsia, won the Governors' Cup, as well as the Southern Golf championship, at Aiken, S. C. Mrs. W. B. McIlvane, of Onwentsia, was the victor in 1899 and last year Miss Bessie Anthony, of Evanston, won the championship after a brisk contest with Mrs John M. Cutter, of the Onwentsia and Exmoor Clubs.

Since the first open championship of the United States Golf Association the professionals attached to the Western golf clubs have carried off the majority of the championship honors. While the geographical position of the leading professionals, who are mainly men of foreign birth is chiefly due to financial considerations, still it speaks well for local golfing enthusiasm that the clubs adjacent to Chicago are willing to pay salaries high enough to make it an object for the

cleverest exponents to ally themselves with Western organizations. Of the six open championships held since 1895, Chicago has carried off the premier honor three times and led the professionals attached to the American clubs last year at Wheaton, when David Bell, of the Midlothian Country Club, finished next to Vardon and Taylor. In 1896, James Foulis, of the Chicago Golf Club, won the open championship at Shinnecock Hills; in 1898 Fred Herd, of Washington Park, won at Myopia, and the following year Willie Smith, of Midlothian, brought the chief trophy to the West.

In 1899 the game had grown so rapidly in the West that it was deemed advisable to secure an organization of the clubs within a radius of 500 miles of Chicago, so the Western Golf Association was formed to act in conjunction with the national body, in the government of the clubs composing it. Arthur P. Bowen, of Riverside, was really the father of the idea and several of the influential local golfers aided him materially, with the result that the Association was a success from its inception. The officers during the initial year of its existence were: President, Hobart C. Chatfield-Taylor, Onwentsia; Vice-president, Arthur P. Bowen, Riverside; Treasurer, George R. Thorne, Midlothian and Secretary Phelps B. Hoyt, Glenview.

The first tournament of the association was held at

the Glenview Club in September, 1899, and was won by David R. Forgan. George R. Thorne, President of the Midlothian Country Club, was so much pleased with the interest shown in the event and the large number of entries, that he donated a \$500 championship cup to be played for annually.

In 1900 the Western championship was held at Onwentsia and after some grand contests, resulting from a high class entry, the event was won by William Waller, at present, captain of the Onwentsia team. This year the W. G. A. championship will be held on the links of the Midlothian Country Club, the dates selected being August 21, 22, 23 and 24.

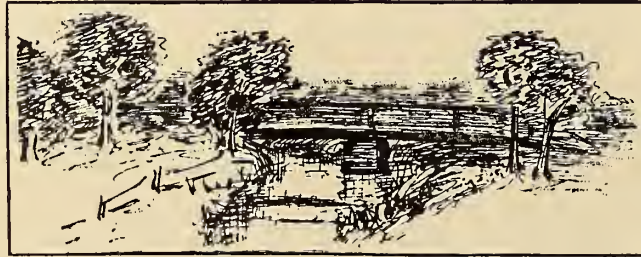

THE Chicago Golf Club was incorporated under the Illinois state laws, on the 18th of July, 1893 its directors for the first year being J. Carolus Stirling, Charles B. Macdonald, James B. Forgan, Ulrich H. Broughton, Hobart C. Chatfield-Taylor, W. R. Farquhar, and J. G. Watson. The original club house and grounds of the Chicago Golf Club were at Belmont, about twenty-two miles from Chicago, but in 1895 the club moved to Wheaton and occupied its present grounds.

The club house and eighteen-hole course are located about a mile from the village of Wheaton, 24.9 miles from Chicago. The grounds embrace about 200 acres of slightly rolling land and there is not a tree on the course. A shallow pond fringing the ninth and tenth holes makes a very desirable water hazard.

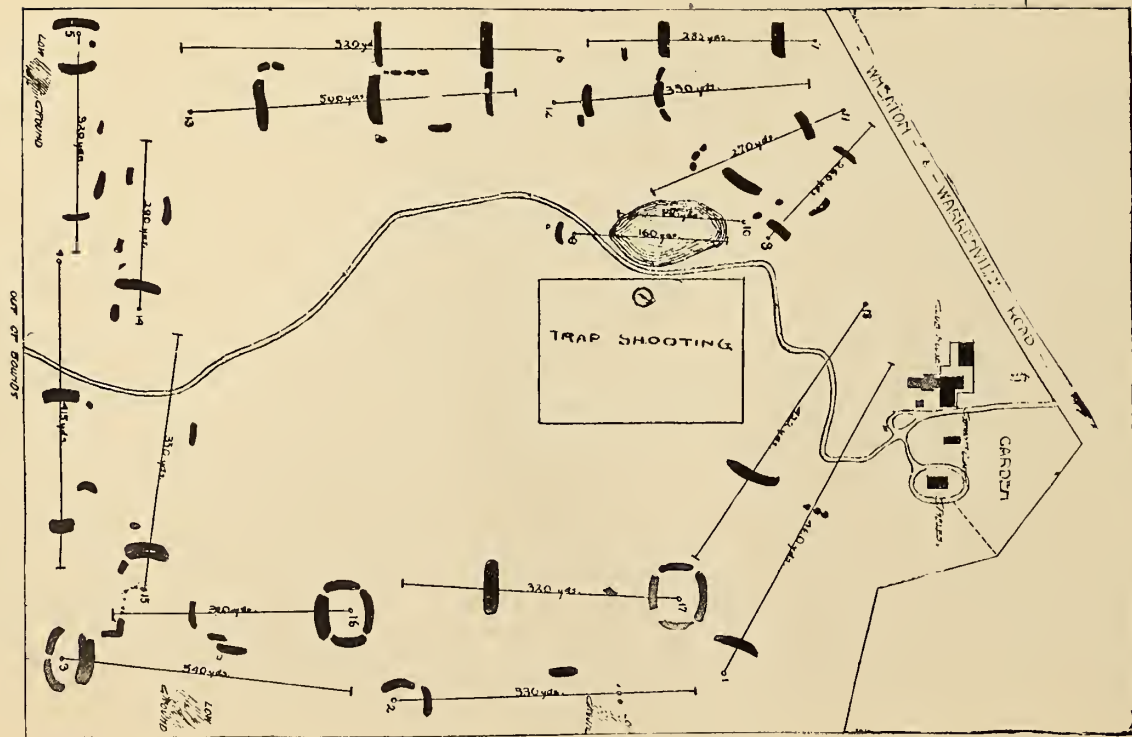


CLUB HOUSE OF THE CHICAGO GOLF CLUB

RESTAURANT.—Service a la carte. Table d'hote only on Thursday and Saturday nights, \$1.25. Sunday luncheon, 75 cents.

CLUB SEAL, COLORS, ETC.

SEAL.—The corporate seal is a circular disk, bearing the words "Chicago Golf Club," the figure of a golf player, and the motto "Far and Sure."

Colors.—Red and white.

HOW TO GET TO THE CHICAGO GOLF CLUB.

Take the Chicago and Northwestern train (Galena Division) at the Wells street depot to Wheaton. Club buses meet all trains and run to the clubhouse about a mile distant. The bus fare is ten cents each way. The railroad fare is 75 cents one way and \$1.25 to Wheaton and return. Commutation rate is 34 cents. About twenty trains a day run on the Chicago and Northwestern railroad between Wheaton and the Wells street depot, Chicago.

MEMBERSHIP.

REGULAR.—Regular members are elected by the unanimous ballot of the directors, and pay an initiation fee of \$100 and annual dues of \$50.

ARMY AND NAVY, ETC.—Officers of the Army and Navy, clergymen, professors of universities residing in Chicago or vicinity, and foreign consuls who are not permanent residents of Chicago, may be admitted to the club as subscribers, paying a subscription of \$5 a month or \$25 for the term of a year, which shall entitle them to the privileges of the club, without ownership or vote.

NON-RESIDENTS.—Temporary residents of Chicago and vicinity and non-residents (male), may be admitted to the club as subscribers, paying a subscription of \$10 per month or \$50 for a calendar year. This entitles them to club privileges, without ownership or vote. Persons not residing or

having places of business within fifty miles of the Chicago City Hall shall be deemed non-residents.

WOMEN.—Ladies over sixteen years of age who are members of the immediate family of a member, shall have the privileges of the course, subject to the rules of the Green Committee, on payment of \$10 a year. Ladies not members of the immediate family of a member of the club, and youths from sixteen to twenty-two years of age, may be granted the privileges of the club as subscribers, on paying a subscription for each calendar year as follows: For lady and her family (not including males themselves eligible for election), \$40; for a single lady or youth from sixteen to twenty-two years of age, \$25.

GUESTS.—Guests may be granted the privileges of the course on payment of \$1 a day, or \$5 per week.

THE club house and grounds of the Exmoor Country Club, which was incorporated under the state laws in 1896, lie west of and immediately beyond the city limits of Highland Park, 23.2 miles from Chicago. The original directors of the club were, J. McGregor Adams, H. T. Birch, J. Wallace Wakem, S. M. Millard, Everett Millard, Vernon Cassard, W. A. Alexander, and Charles W. Fullerton. The main club house, which was built in 1897, resembles the modern Grecian style of architec-

ture and faces west, its veranda commanding a splendid view of the course.

Up to the close of last season, the Exmoor course consisted of nine holes but during the fall, nine more were added.

The grounds embrace 100 acres of suitable land, the turf being considered about the finest around Chicago. Six-inch water mains, over 6,500 feet long are responsible for having the ground in shape for early play.

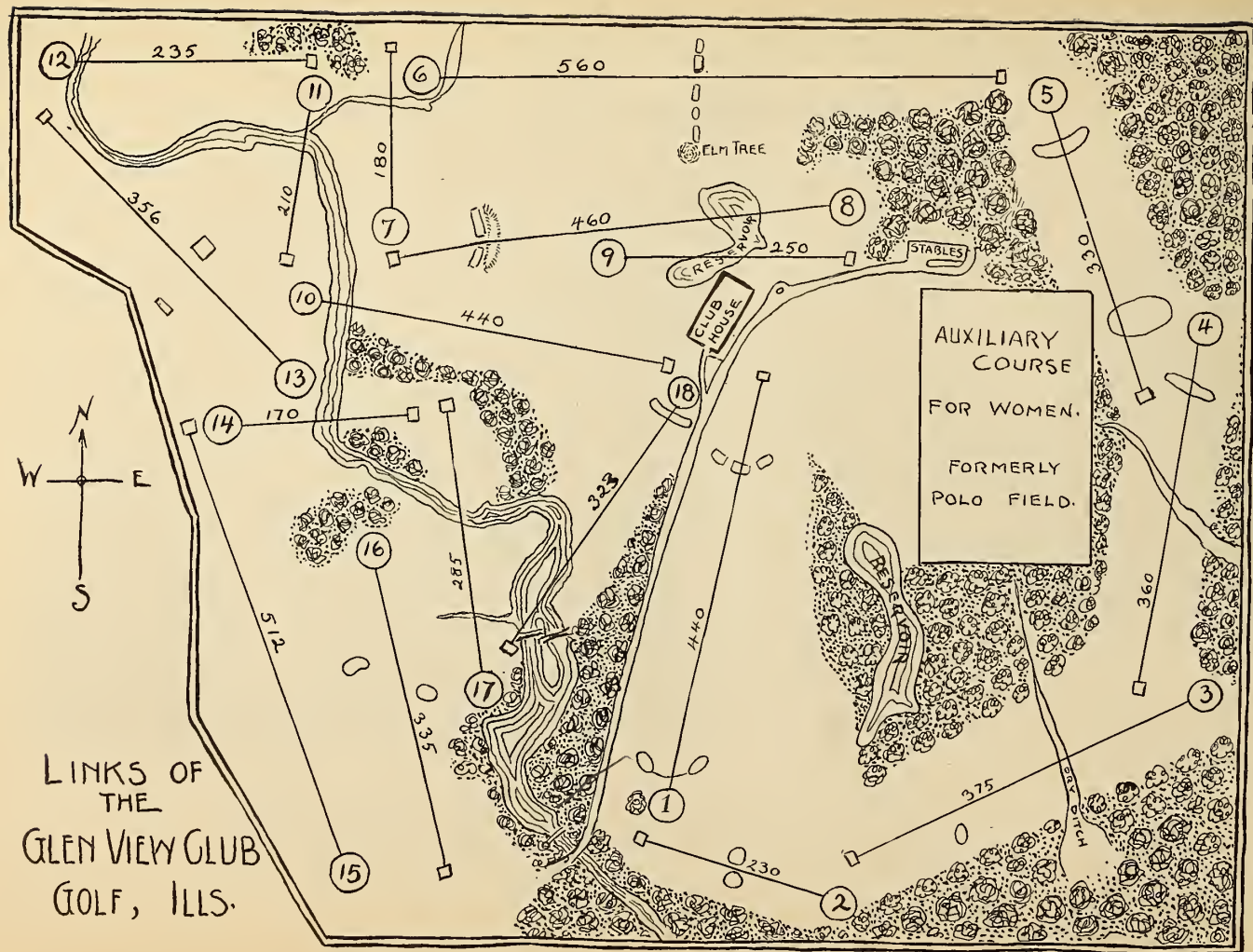
John M. Allen, Marshall M. Kirkman, Martin M. Gridley, Frederick S. Martin, William H. Bartlett and Richard C. Lake.

HOW TO GET TO GLENVIEW.

Take the Chicago, Milwaukee and St. Paul railroad to Golf station, a run of about thirty minutes from the Union depot, Canal and Madison streets. Club 'buses connect with the clubhouse about two-thirds of a mile distant. 'Buses also run to Evanston, six miles distant, twice daily. The

'bus fare from the depot to the clubhouse is ten cents each way, and the fare to Evanston on the regular 'buses is 25 cents each way. The railroad fare to Golf station is 45 cents one way, and 75 cents to Golf station and return. Commutation tickets—10 rides, \$1.75; 25 rides, \$3.55.

MEMBERSHIP.

WOMEN MEMBERS.—Ladies of the immediate family of a member may enjoy the privileges of the club, without ownership or vote. Ladies, not members of the immediate family of a member of the club, may be admitted to the privileges of the club, without ownership or vote, subject to such rules and regulations as the Board of Directors may adopt, upon paying a subscription of twenty-five dollars (\$25) for each calendar year. Women and children over twelve years of age, of the immediate family of a regular member of the club, will, upon payment of \$10 annually, be entitled to play over the course.

JUNIOR MEMBERS.—Sons of regular members under the age of eighteen years may be elected as junior members of the club upon the payment of annual dues of twenty-five dollars (\$25), without initiation fee. Such junior members shall have no vote or ownership by virtue of such membership.

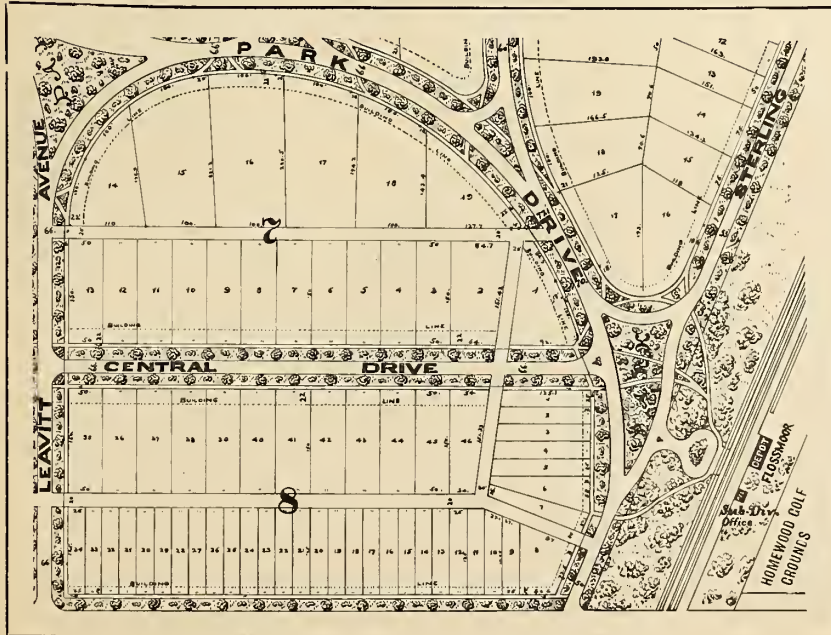

HOW TO GET TO HOMEWOOD.

The Illinois Central, on the main line of which Homewood is situated, runs sixteen trains a day in each direction at convenient intervals between Chicago and Flossmoor station. The running time of regular trains is about fifty minutes and the specials thirty-five minutes. Cafe cars are attached on Saturday, so that members can obtain luncheon on their way to the grounds. Special train on Saturday leaves Randolph street at 12:45 p. m., returning at 5:30 p. m. The clubhouse is about two blocks from the depot. The railroad fare one way is 24 cents. For round trip, 48 cents. Twenty-five ride tickets, \$4.80.

MEMBERSHIP.

STOCK MEMBERSHIP.—An original subscriber to two shares of stock, of the par value of one hundred dollars per share, in the Homewood Association shall be entitled to membership in this club without payment of initiation fees.

STOCKHOLDER LIFE MEMBERSHIP.—An original subscriber to twenty shares of stock, of the par value of one hundred dollars per share, in the Homewood Association shall be entitled to membership in this club, without payment of initiation fee or dues throughout the life of the holder of such membership, and shall be entitled to the full privileges of the club.

LIFE MEMBERSHIP.—Any person properly elected, may

become a life member by payment of \$500, and shall be exempt from the payment of annual dues. The club shall not take in more than twenty members on this basis.

NON-RESIDENT MEMBERS.—Persons living more than fifty miles from Homewood shall be eligible for election to non-resident membership. Such members shall pay an initiation fee of fifty dollars and an annual subscription of twenty-five dollars and shall not vote at club elections.

WOMEN MEMBERSHIPS.—Widows may be elected to membership in the club. Such members shall pay an initiation fee of fifty dollars and an annual subscription of twenty-five dollars. Members of their families shall be entitled to the same privileges as those of other members. Unmarried women may be elected to membership in this club. Such members shall pay an initiation fee of fifty dollars and an annual subscription of twenty-five dollars. Women members shall be permitted to vote at the club elections.

JUNIOR MEMBERSHIP.—Sons of regular members, between the ages of 15 and 23 years, may be elected as junior members, and shall pay an annual subscription of twenty-five dollars, and shall not vote at club elections. Ladies, not wives of members, of the immediate family of members, above the age of 15 years, shall be admitted to the use of the courses by the payment of an annual subscription of ten dollars each.

CLERGYMEN AND UNIVERSITY PROFESSORS' MEMBERSHIPS.—Clergymen and university professors, to the

number of thirty, may be elected to special membership in this club. They shall pay an initiation fee of fifty dollars and an annual subscription of forty dollars.

ANNUAL DUES.—The annual dues of stockholders and regular members shall be forty dollars per year, payable in two equal installments on the first of May and September.

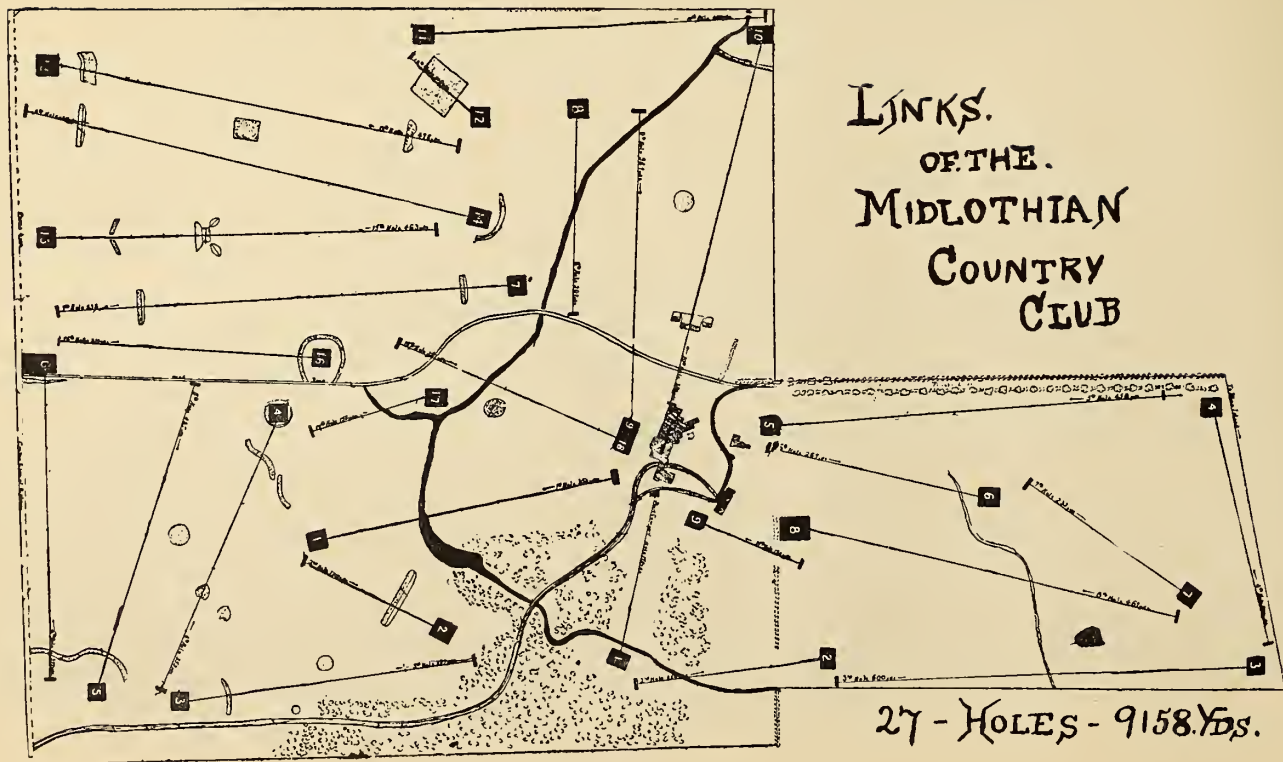

HOW TO GET TO MIDLOTHIAN.

Take the Chicago and Rock Island Railroad at Van Buren and Sherman streets to Midlothian station or the Illinois Central Railroad at the Twelfth street station to Blue Island. The directors of the Midlothian Club have just installed a railroad operated by the club between the clubhouse and Midlothian station. Suburban and express trains on the Chicago and Rock Island Railroad are met at Midlothian station and passengers conveyed on the "Midlothian Limited" to the clubhouse.

MEMBERSHIP.

Junior members shall be entitled to the use of the clubhouse, but shall not be admitted to the smoking-room, or any of its privileges, nor shall they be permitted to take part in any of the sports on the club grounds on Saturday afternoons and holidays, unless they shall have paid an additional subscription of \$25 for the full privileges of the grounds on all days, and shall be known as "Junior Subscription Members."

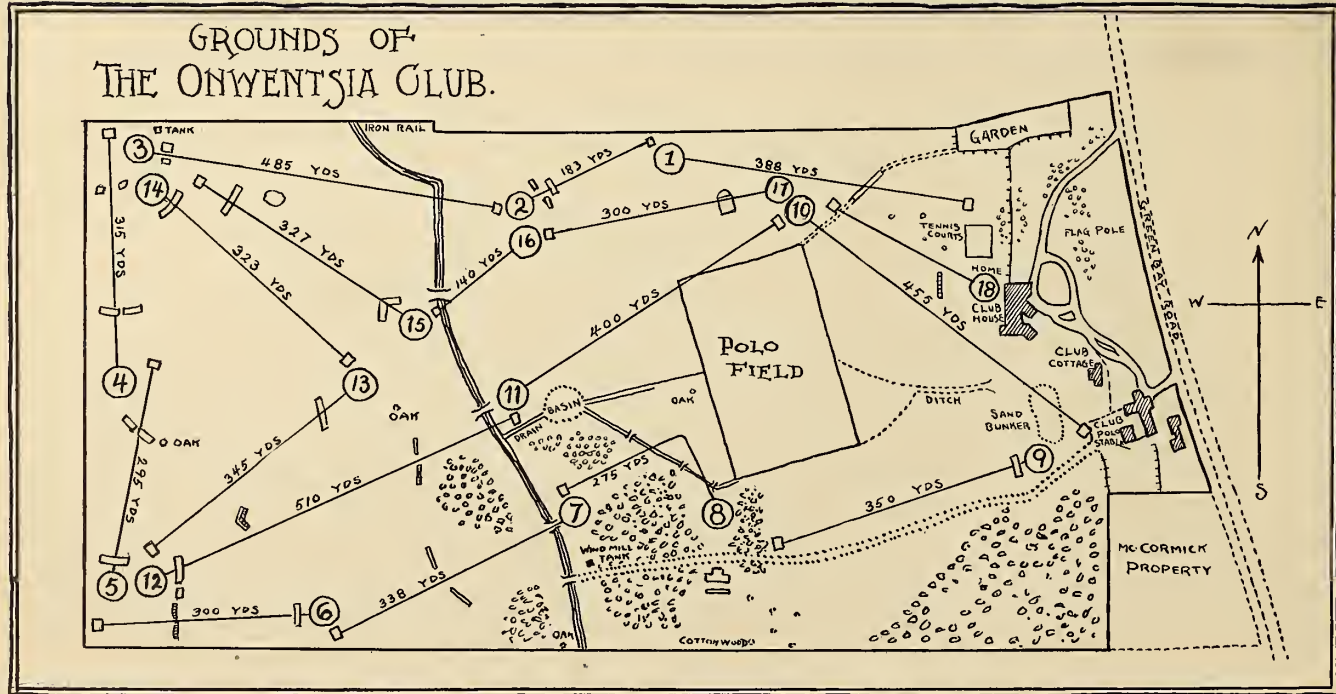

CLUB GOLF COAT.—A four-buttoned, single-breasted jacket of scarlet flannel or serge, with club buttons; collar, navy blue, edged with a piping of yellow flannel, one-sixteenth of an inch wide; cuffs, navy blue, four inches in width, and edged with a piping of yellow flannel similar to the collar.

HOW TO GET TO ONWENTSIA.

Take the Chicago and Northwestern railroad (Milwaukee Division) at the Wells street depot to Lake Forest, where club 'buses meet all trains and convey members and visitors to the clubhouse, about three-fourths of a mile from the station. The Onwentsia Club is the only local golfing organization at present which supplies free 'buses for its patrons. The railroad fare to Lake Forest is 85 cents one way and \$1.45 for round trip. Commutation tickets 38 cents each. Trains run frequently at convenient hours on the Chicago and Northwestern between Lake Forest and the Wells street depot.

MEMBERSHIP.

RESIDENT MEMBERS.—Each member of the club shall pay an initiation fee of \$100, and annual dues of \$50.

LIFE MEMBERS.—In order to become a life member, a payment of \$400 additional to the regular entrance fee is required. The number of life members is limited to twenty, who shall be exempt from the payment of dues.

JUNIOR LIFE MEMBERS.—A junior member of the club, upon payment of \$500, may be elected a junior life member, the number of such junior life members not to exceed ten. Upon attaining the age of twenty-one years, a junior life member may be elected a life member of the club without further payment, but should he fail of election his entrance fee of \$500 shall be returned to him without interest, and he shall cease to be a member of the club.

NON-RESIDENT MEMBERS.—Persons living more than fifty miles from Lake Forest shall be eligible for election as non-resident members, and such members shall pay an entrance fee of \$50, and an annual subscription of \$20.

ARMY AND NAVY MEMBERS.—Officers of the army and navy of the United States who may be elected members of the club shall be exempt from the payment of an initiation fee, and shall pay the dues of non-resident members, but shall not have the privilege of proposing or seconding candidates for membership.

UNIVERSITY MEMBERS.—Professors of Lake Forest University are eligible for membership in the same manner as officers of the army and navy of the United States.

CONSULAR MEMBERS.—Consuls of foreign nations, in Chicago, are eligible for membership in the same manner as officers of the army and navy of the United States, except that their annual dues shall be \$50.

WOMEN MEMBERS.—Widows and unmarried women

may be elected to membership in the club. The entrance fee for such members shall be \$100, and the annual subscription \$25, and their families shall be entitled to the same privileges as the families of other members, but such members shall not be included in the limits of membership.

JUNIOR MEMBERS.—Sons and brothers of members, between the ages of twelve and twenty-one years, may, upon payment of \$10 annual subscription, become junior members of the club. An additional annual subscription of \$25 for the full privileges of the grounds on all days.

WIVES, DAUGHTERS AND SISTERS OF MEMBERS.—Wives of members and the unmarried daughters and sisters of members over twelve years shall be entitled to the privileges of the clubhouse, and on payment of \$10 annual subscription each, they shall be entitled to the privileges of the outdoor sports of the club, except on Saturday afternoons and holidays.

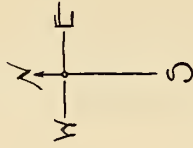
The club very recently (1901) made some alterations in its course by abandoning the last and the first two holes and placing three new drives upon some land only lately acquired.

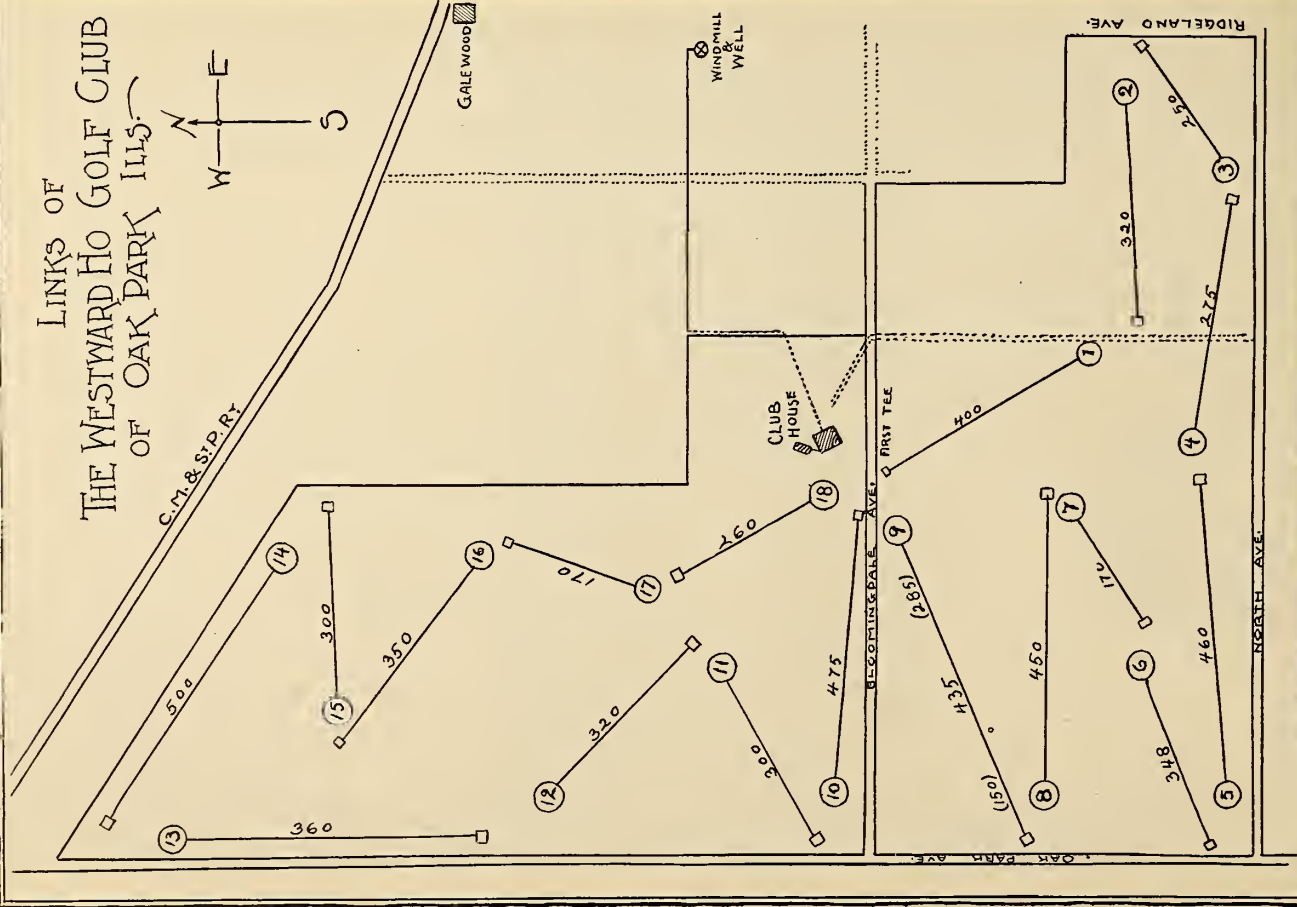

THE Belmont Golf Club was organized in February, 1899, and incorporated the following month. The links is laid out over the old Smith farm at Belmont, where the Chicago Golf Club had its original home until 1895. The Illinois Golf Club, which was formed in 1895, also used the links at Belmont until its dissolution, so that the present organization is the third club occupying the course since 1893.

Belmont is about twenty-two miles from Chicago and the comfortable clubhouse is only a few hundred yards from the depot.

The founders of the club were Kennedy R. Owen, Walter Hemsley, W. C. Asay, H. J. Tweedie, Collin C. H. Fyffe, Henry King, T. O. Peterson, George C. Power and R. W. Chanler. The course is of nine holes, occupying about 47 acres of rolling country well studied with natural and artificial hazards.

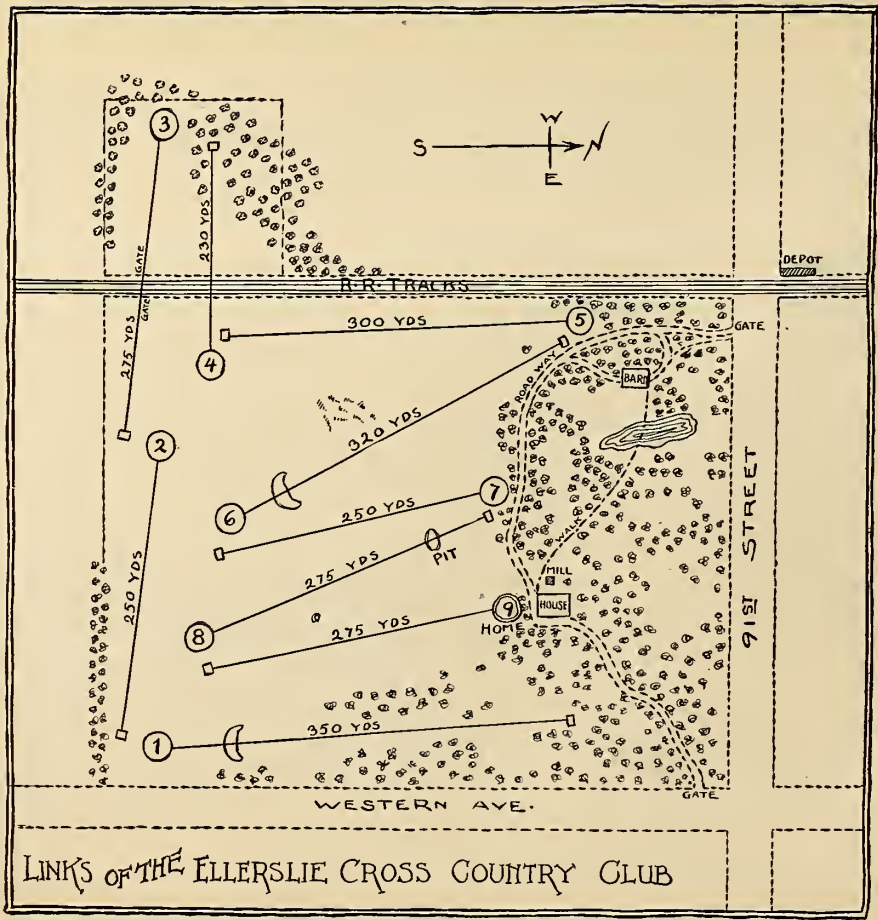

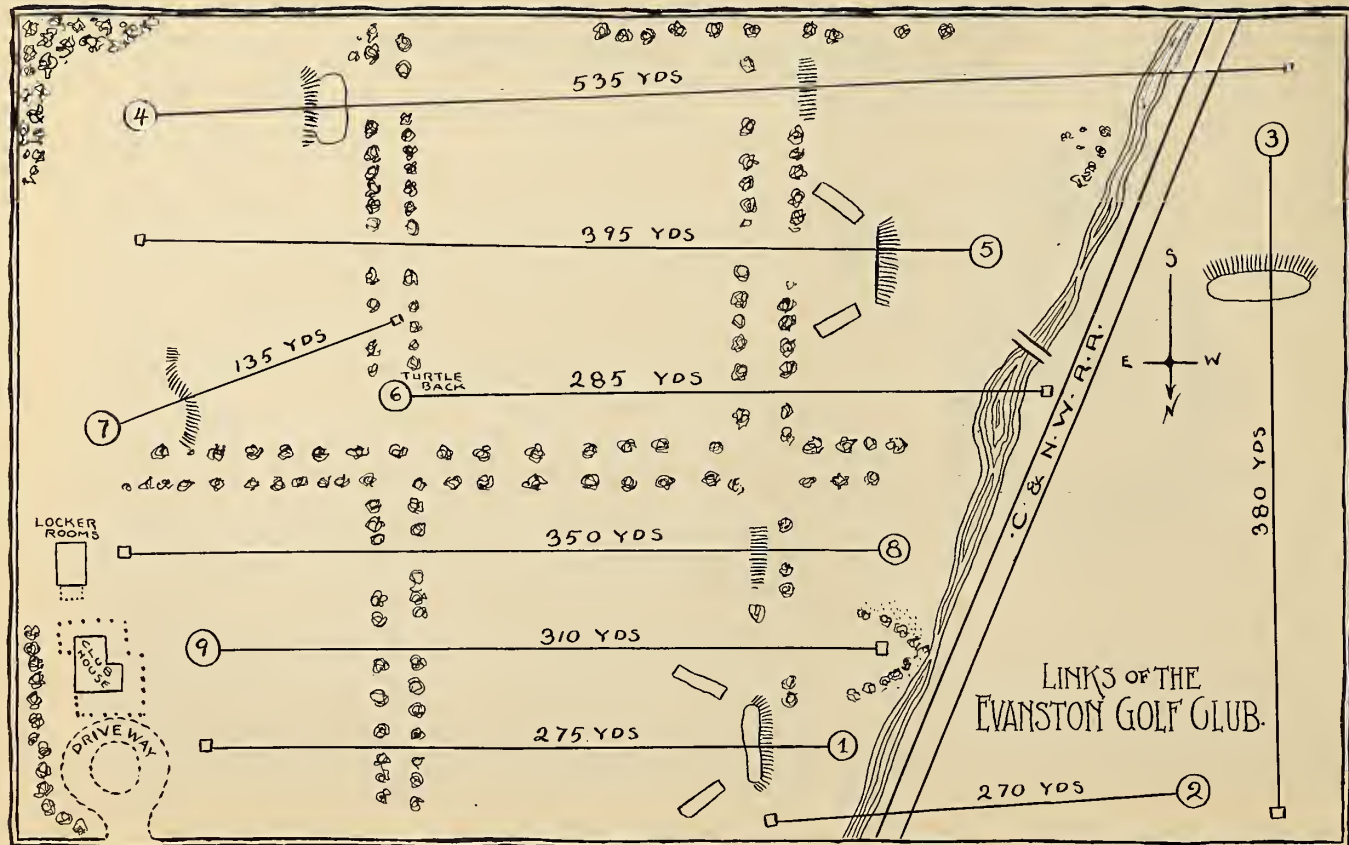

entertaining from one hundred to one hundred and twenty-five each season.

The apparent need of such a home within easy reach of the working girls of Chicago, and the inability to secure a suitable house, led the circle to take a decisive step and endeavor to own its own home next year.

As a means of revenue for this building fund, the Golf Auxiliary to the circle has been reorganized. The course is over the Kidder links—Lincoln street and East Railroad avenue, North Evanston—the use of which has been given to the Auxiliary without rent.

The course is very accessible, being within one block of the Northwestern station at North Evanston, and the Evanston electric cars, and is in good condition.

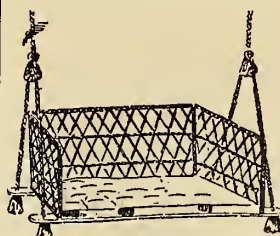

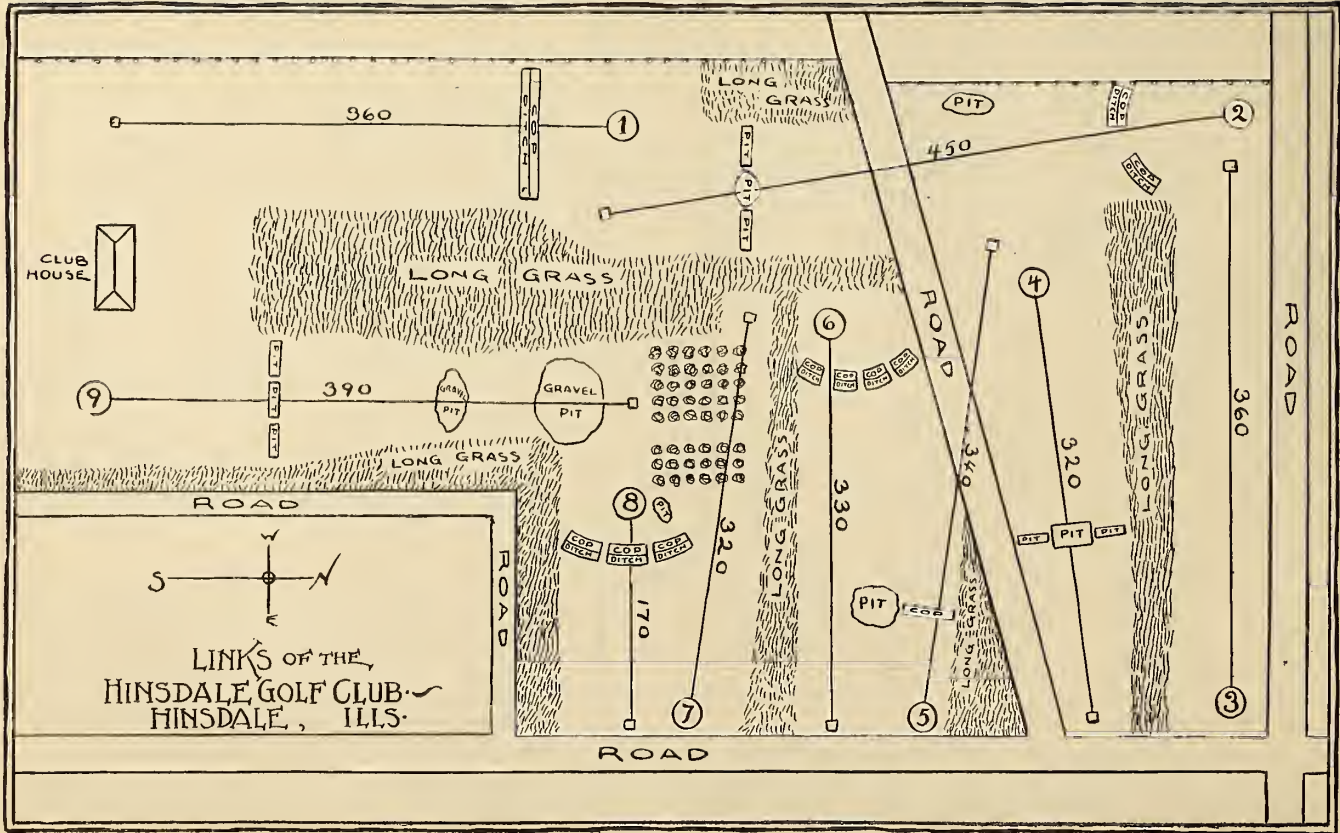

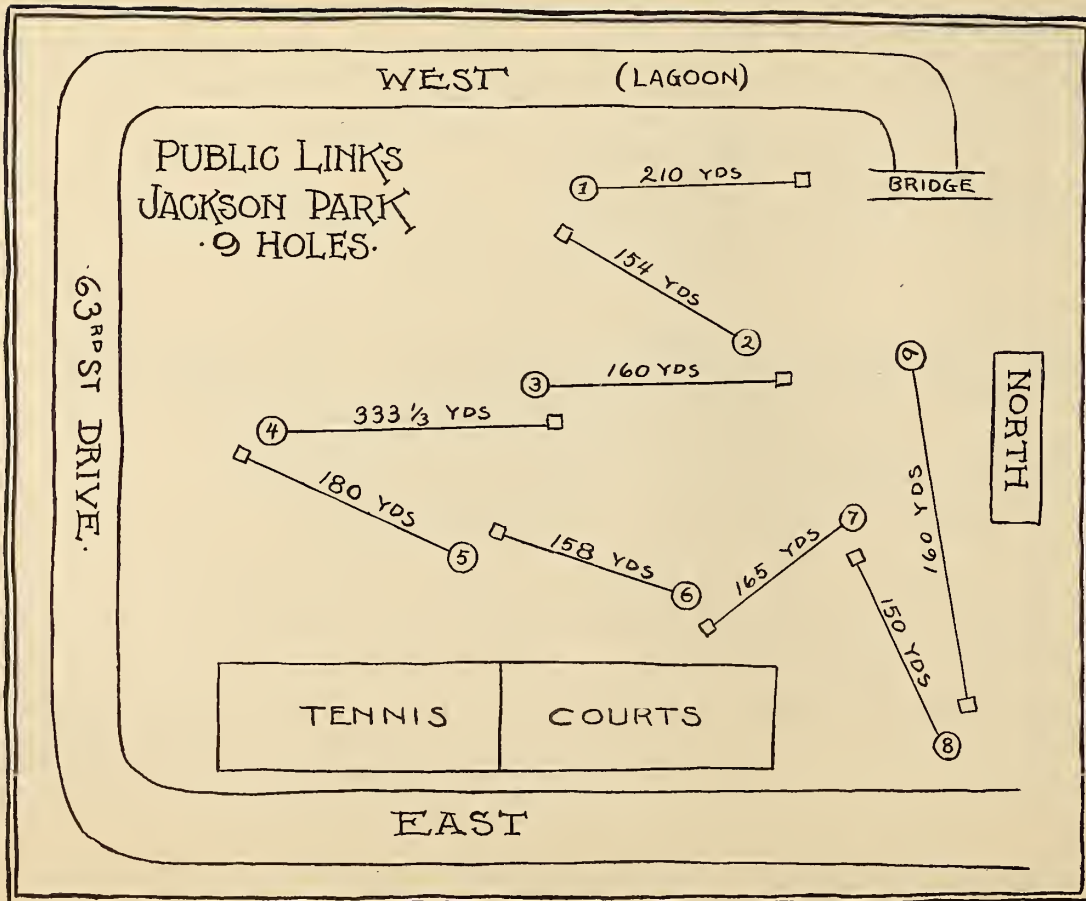

CHICAGO'S only public golf course is laid out in Jackson Park, about seven and one-half miles south of the City Hall. The links are under the jurisdiction of the South Park Commissioners. The original nine holes were laid out in April, 1899, and were superseded in 1900 by an eighteen-hole course, which in turn was abolished last fall and another nine-hole course substituted, which will be in shape for play

at the opening of the season of 1901. Another eighteen-hole course has been designed, which it is expected will be playable before the season closes, when the present nine holes will be used as an auxiliary.

The nine holes are laid out over forty acres of flat ground adjoining the tennis courts and are devoid of natural hazards.

THE Newspaper Golf Club of Chicago was organized in October, 1899, and incorporated the following month. From that time until May, 1901, its clubhouse and grounds were situated in Oak Park at West Madison street and Carpenter avenue. The officers of the club during the first year of its corporate existence were: John D. Sherman, president; Edward G. Westlake and Worthington Wright, vice-presidents; William H. Freeman, treasurer, and Joseph E. G. Ryan, secretary. During the fall of 1900 a nine-hole course was laid out on the infield of the Harlem race track and early this spring the Newspaper Golf Club leased it for a term of five years and commenced play in May. While the ground is flat, it contains enough hazards to make play very interesting, the obstructions consisting chiefly of steeplechase jumps, swampy ground outside of the line of play, and a pond going to the third hole. 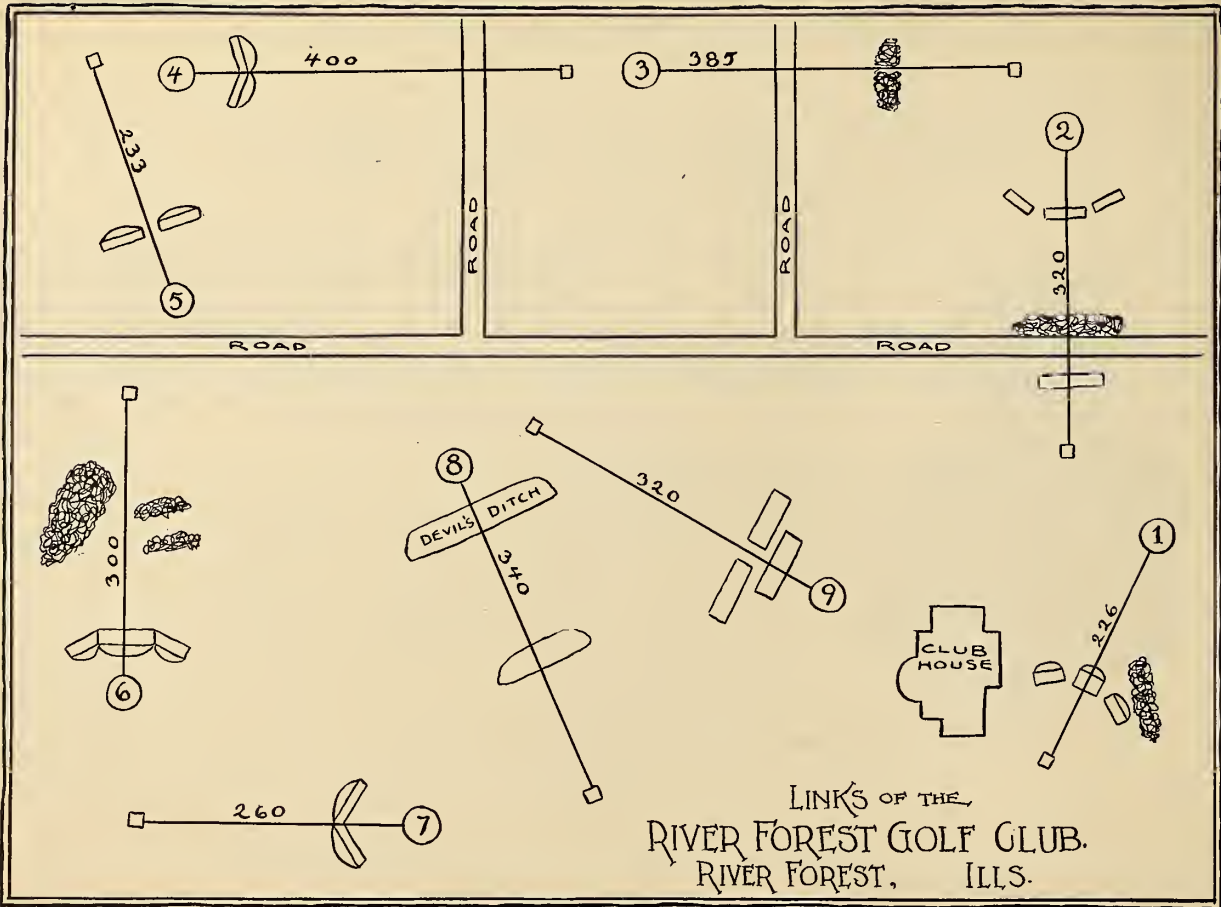

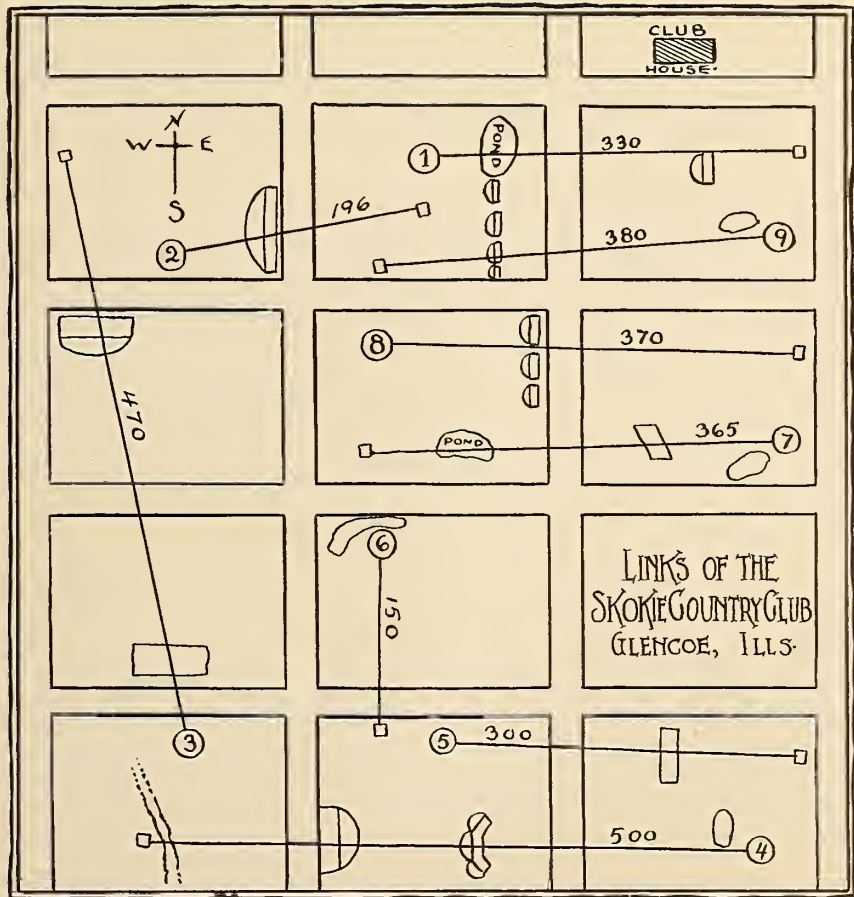

THE Washington Park Club was organized in 1883 and incorporated the same year, but it was only in 1895 that golf was added as a feature. The clubhouse and grounds are situated about seven miles from the City Hall, at Sixty-first street and South Park avenue. The members who were mainly responsible for the introduction of golf were: Eugene R. Pike, C. B. Macdonald, D. Mark Cummings, C. J. Barnes and Lorin C. Collins, Jr. The course, which is of nine holes, is laid out over about eighty-five acres of flat ground. The hazards are mostly artificial, although three ponds make play very interesting. The other hazards consist of fences, bunkers and the racetrack.

The score card, with the name, distance and bogey of each hole, appears on a following page.

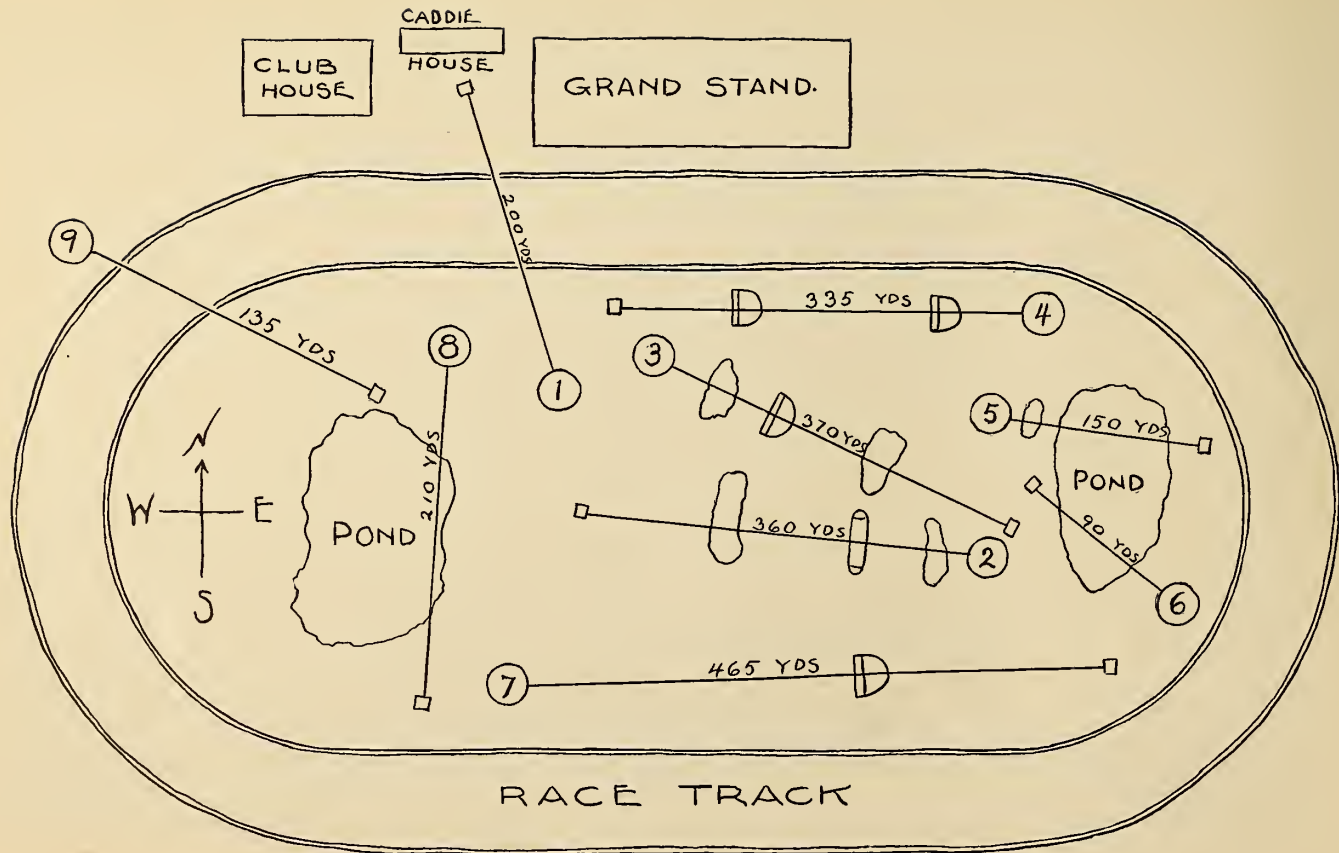

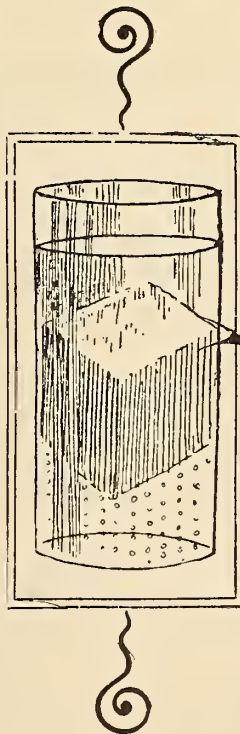
